

New bunkhouse accommodation for Holyhead Sea Cadets



Holyhead Sea Cadets, formed in 1942, was created to give young people instruction on a naval theme.

With 400 Sea Cadet Units across the UK, each unit has charitable status and supports a tradition of community activity. All Units are members of the Sea Cadet Corps, governed by a national charity; the Marine Society & Sea Cadets.

The project has refurbished and modernised a self-contained building to create bunkhouse style self-catering accommodation to cater for other cadet units, outdoor pursuits groups and youth organisations. The building is owned by Holyhead Sea Cadets, and is located at their site at Newry Beach in Holyhead. The funding package consisted of funding from the Welsh Government Community Facilities & Activities Programme and Cyfenter through Menter Môn.

An Open weekend was held on the 17th of May to give people the opportunity to view the new facilities.
